No 12 Foxbury Place is a two-bedroom bungalow with approximate room dimensions as follows:

Foxbury Place is a small development of retirement cottages and bungalows built in and around some farm buildings and arranged in two courtyards. The estate was completed in 1987 and most of the properties have their own small private gardens and either a greenhouse/garden store or a conservatory.

Services

These include estate management and emergency alarm system. There is a communal laundry and parking is in the first courtyard with either spaces or car ports.

Location

Great Bedwyn is a sought-after village with good local services set in beautiful countryside about five miles west of Hungerford and about the same distance from Marlborough. Fast trains from Great Bedwyn to London (Paddington) take a little over an hour.

Marlborough has one of the widest and grandest high streets in England and the town's buildings testify to the prosperity it has enjoyed over the centuries. It has all the essential shops and services within its high street including a Waitrose and is home to both the renowned Marlborough College and Polly Tea Rooms.

Hungerford is about five miles to the east and has an attractive high street with pubs and restaurants and many antique shops.

The Savernake Forest has over 4,500 acres of forest and parkland and close by are Avebury's ancient standing stones and the beautiful National Trust village of Lacock.
